FAMILY UPDATE

Our summer in a nutshell: visiting different churches, attending our national staff conference in CO (see page 1), trying to sell our house (lots of packing) and taking Arthur to many doctors.

There was some concern because he walks on his toes (past the “normal” age) and has had some sensory issues (sensitive to sound, touch, etc). We are convinced God’s hand was involved, with so many praying, and we have seen changes in him over the summer—his MRI results showed everything is fine, the re-test of bloodwork came back fine, and he no longer freaks out when he hears loud noises or gets his face wet—in fact he has learned to swim and do flips underwater! As far as the toe-walking, he needs to do physical therapy for a while but he’s already made progress. We’re still seeing an ophthalmologist about his eye crossing, trying to determine if we can avoid surgery (again, we’ve seen improvement and each step seems to help). Our last step is bifocals, which we got today (please pray as he adjusts). We are even less excited about surgery since experiencing Arthur after his MRI sedation (see bottom article). Apart from that, Arthur has been a sweet little champ. So creative, he has been drawing pictures and making up stories, [Click here](#) to see a video of one.



Katherine loves building little nests out of pillows and blankets in every hidden corner. She always seems to have control over the situation, or at least she thinks she does, and is supremely confident in herself. She loves to draw, build with Trio blocks, and have all kinds of adventures (real and imaginary) with her big brother.

Churches: We have really loved visiting our partners around NJ to say “thank you” and talk about our upcoming transition to Cru headquarters in Orlando. We’ve connected with old friends, made new ones, and seen God provide for our needs. Since my mom graciously watched our kids during those travels, we were able to have grownup conversations and enjoy the hospitality of different friends who hosted us on different visits.



House: A cool story that isn’t finished: we have been praying that God would bless our house in South Jersey to someone who could use it for ministry, but it sat on the market for months with only 2 people even coming to look at it, 1 of whom made an offer. During a packing trip there, we met a couple in a restaurant whose kids are nearly the same age as ours. It turns out the husband, Justin, is the pastor of a local church-plant who loves Cru. We quickly became friends and found out that they were the people who had put the offer on our house! Please pray that their own house sells and for things to work out for both of our families financially. It looks like we are going to lose a significant amount of money, but it might be that God wants us to take this step of faith anyway. Please pray for Him to make His will clear here!

WHAT GOD’S BEEN TEACHING US

We had a week of “mountaintop experience” at CSU: worshipping God, connecting with Him and with fellow believers, and really having our hearts filled up. The day after we came home, we woke up at 4:30am, put Arthur in the car for 2+ hours to Philly, then watched our little guy get sedated and wheeled away into the MRI room to see whether he had any serious ailments (like muscular dystrophy or cerebral palsy). That was the easy part.

A couple hours later we watched helplessly as he flailed and screamed while two doctors held him down. We were assured this was within the “normal” range of reactions to coming out of sedation, and that it would wear off over time, but even they seemed shocked and emotional as time went by and this gentle child was punching and kicking in fury as he tried to escape.

We saw gradual improvement over the next couple days, and it became clear that much of his rage was based on a firm but mistaken belief that he was able to walk on his own. He seemed not to notice his constant loss of balance, but kept getting mad at us for holding onto him. How often do we fight God, thinking that we can control our own lives? He patiently holds us down and cares for us. We’re thankful to the Lord for showing us a powerful example of [Proverbs 3:5](#) and giving us the strength to get through that difficult experience. We’re also thankful that the tests showed everything is normal! Here is a pic of Arthur with Mrs. Pam at physical therapy. We keep seeing improvement!



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
